
\*\*Abstract\*\*

A critical dimension in the development of emerging community-engaged scholars is the advisor-advisee relationship during the students's doctoral degree program. A qualitative study of four doctoral students interested in doing community-engaged dissertation research, and their advisors, identified five characteristics of such relationships (1) background and experience matter; (2) faculty advisors and advisors and advisors and advisors and office the community-engaged dissertation studies of her experience matter; (2) faculty advisors and advisors and store serve as interpreters and interveners; and (5) community-engaged dissertation studies offen lack "structural" support. 
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Units include some or all of these components:





